

July 15, 1881. Whereas Leonard Grates has utterly failed to comply with the terms and condition of the contract heretofore and on the 29th day of October 1880 entered into between him and said Leonard Grates and the Board of Supervisors of the Town of Chaska, whereby the building of a stone culvert bridge on the (so called) Chaska-Carver Road on the line of the SW quarter of Sect. 8, Twp. 115, Range 23 was contracted for.

Resolved that the Town of Chaska is hereby instructed to call upon said Leonard Grates to remove from said highway the mason work placed therein by him at the place where such bridge was to have been constructed, and to notify said Leonard Grates that unless the same is so removed within 10 days from the day of the service of notice hereof upon him then said Board of Supervisors will cause the same to be removed at his said Grates expense, and Resolved that said Town Clerk be and he is hereby requested to demand from said Grates payment of the 300 dollars heretofore and on the 23th day of November 1880 advanced to him on account of the price for the construction of said bridge, and notify said Grates that unless the same is paid within 30 days from this date hereof an action at law will be brought to recover the same.

Copy served on Leonard Grates by reading and tendering a copy thereof on July 16, 1881. Peter Weego Town Clerk.

Oct. 5, 1881. Board of Supervisors entered into a contract with John D. Skone (Skone) for building of a spile bridge on Chaska-Road where the stone culvert was to have been built, said bridge to be built in accordance with the plans and specification on file with the Town Clerk, and to be completed on or before the 1st October A.D. 1881 for the sum of 650 dollars. Resolved that the aforesaid John D. Skone be required to give Bonds of 1,000.00 dollars Surities by E. Holmes and A.P. Peterson.

43 October 11, 1881. A petition was presented by a number of taxpayers of the Town of Chaska requesting the Town Board of Supervisors to settle and adjust the cause now pending in the District Court. Resolved that the claims of Leonard Grates against the Town growing out of the contract heretofore entered into between said Leonard Grates and the Town of Chaska for the construction of a stone culvert on the Chaska-Carver road, and on which suit has been commenced by said Leonard Grates, which suit is now pending in District Court of Carver County be settled and compromised upon the following terms;

The Town of Chaska pays to said Leonard Grates 300 dollars in addition to the amount heretofore paid to him upon such contract, payments therefore to be made in 4 weeks from the date of in cash or Town orders of the Town of Chaska, drawing interest at 8 per cent per annum, and also surrenders all claims to the bricks used in the construction of said bridge. Said Leonard Grates agrees to dismiss the action now pending and heretofore referred to, without costs to the Town, and receive the bricks and the sum of 300 dollars above specified in full for all claims and demands against the Town growing out of said contract.

Dec. 21, 1881. Whereas the petition of Andrew Riedele and others for a Cartway was taken up for consideration, and whereas the same has been duly consirered, therefore Resolved that said petition be and the same is hereby rejected.

March 14, 1882. The annual Town meeting was called to order at Nine and one half o'clock A.M. by Peter Weego Town Clerk, who read the call as notice of said Town meeting. On motion Fred Iltis was chosen as Moderator. The Moderator stated the order of business as follows;

- # 1, Reading of the annual Report. # 2, Adoption of the By-Laws. # 3, Election of Pound Master. # 4, Levy of Taxes. # 5, Miscellaneous business. # 6, Opening of the Polls.

The annual report was read by the Town clerk, and a motion to accept it. No domestic animals (except cows) shall be allowed to run at large between the hours of 9 o'clock P.M. and 5 o'clock A.M., also Geese are prohibited to run at large during the entire year. The Highway labor for the ensueing year shall be 2 days work on the road by each and every person liable to perform. August Arndt was elected Pound Master by acclamation.
