

Pursudent to an "Act" passed by the Legislation of the State of Minnesota on the Twentieth day of March A.D. 1858. "Entitled an Act to provide for Township Organization". The Legal Voters of the Town of Chaska assembled at the Office of T.D. Smith in said Town on the Eleventh day of May A.D. 1858 at 9 and three-quarter O'Clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of holding their first "Town Meeting".

The boundries of said Town is as follows, to Wit; Commencing at the Township line between Section one (1) and two (2) of Township one hundred and fifteen (115) of Range twenty-three (23) West, thence running eleven (11) miles West to the Northeast corner of Benton Township, thence three (3) miles South to Section line between eighteen (18) and nineteen (19), thence four (4) miles East on said Section line to Section line between Section fourteen (14) and fifteen (15), thence one (1) mile North to Section line between Section eleven (11) and fourteen (14), thence four and one-quarter (41) miles East on said Section line to the Minnesota River, thence Northeastly on River to Section line between Section one (1) and two (2), thence up North on said Section line to the place of the beginning.

"Entitled an Act. to provide for Township Organization". The Legal Voters of the Town of Chaska assembled at the Office of T.D. Smith in said Town on the Eleventh day of May A.D. 1858 at 9 and three-quarter O'Clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of holding their first "Town Meeting".

The boundries of said Town is as follows, to Wit; Commencing at the Township line between Sections one and two of Township one-hundred and fifteen (115) of Range twenty-three (23) West, then running West to the N.E. corner of Benton Township, thence South to Section line between 18 and 19, thence East on said Section line to to Section line between Section 14 and 15, thence North to Section line between Section 11 and 14, thence East on said Section line to the Minnesota River, thence Northeastly on River to Section line between Section 1 and 2, thence up North on said Section line to the place of the beginning.

Said meeting was called to order by T.D. Smith, and on Motion of Frederick Greiner, T.D. Smith was chosen Moderator, and Cyrus S. Wright clerk by acclamation. The Polls were opened at 9 and threequarter o'clock A.M. and continued open until 5 o'clock P.M. with an adjourment of one hour from 12 o'clock noon until one o'clock P.M. by vote of said meeting.

Agreeable to the above named act the Supervisors in and for the Town of Chaska, met at the office of the Town Clerk in and for said Town on the second day of June A.D. 1858 at 10 o'clock A.M. And proceeded to business as follows, to wit; First, Division of Road Districts in the Town of Chaska, Second, appointment of a Road Supervisor.

First Road District is bounded as follows, to wit; Commencing at the line between Township lines 115 and 116, where it intersects the Minnesota River unning West on said Township line to Section line between Section 5 and 6, thence South two miles to Section between Section 7 and 8, thence East to the Minnesota River, thence down said River to the place of beginning.

Second District commencing at the N.E. corner of Section 6 Township 115 Range 23 running West of said Township line three miles to the Section line between Section 2 and 3, thence South two miles on Section line between said 2 and 3 to Section line between Section 11 and 14, thence East on said Section line to Section line between Section 7 and 8, thence North 2 miles to place of beginning.

Third District commencing at the North-East corner of Section 3
Township 115 Range 24 running West on said Township line 2 miles
to Section line between Section 4 and 5, thence South on Section
between Section 16 and 17, thence East on Section line between Section 16 and 21 two miles to the Section line between Section 14 and
15, thence North on said Section line to the place of beginning.

Fourth District commencing at the N.E. corner of Section 5 Township 115 Range 24 running West two miles to the Range line between Range 24 and 25, thence South three miles to the Section line between Section 18 and 19, thence East two miles to the Section line between tween Section 16 and 17, thence North on said Section line to the place of beginning.

Whereas the Road Supervisor of the First Road District Jacob Ebinger (Elected) has been Legally excused from serving because he already was elected as Assessor, Matthias Iltis was appointed in his place.

The Road Supervisors for this Town stands as follows, to wit;

John Kuntz, third District. Ferdinand Strache, fourth District.

No other business coming bedste this Honorable Board of Town. Supervisors, ther adjourned until the third day in July A.D. 1858 at ten o'clock A.M.

Pursuant to adjourment the Supervisors met at my Office at 10 o'clock A.M. and voted that Each Male inhabitand of the Town (over the age of 21 years) Should perform four (4) days Labor on the Public Highway as a partial payment of his Tax for the year 1858, And instruct the Town Clerk to notify the Road Supervisors of the above fact.

No other business coming before this Board, they adjourned, Sine die.

Monday October 18, 1858, Supervisors met at my office at 9 and threequarters o'clock A.M. and transacted the following business to wit; Acceped the Plat of the resurvey of a part of Chasks and Clear Water road. Instructed the Clerk to notify Peter Hesse Road overseer of the second Road Districto open that part of the road running from the Chasks - Clear Water Road in Section 1, Town 115, Range 24 by Jacob Slicher's and terminating in Section Four, Range notified. Voted to Slicher's and terminating in Section Four, District) Thirty Dollars give John Kuntz (Road overseer of the third District) Thirty Dollars in Town orders. Instructed the Clerk to make (Six) five dollar orders and give John Kuntz on his account vis this Town.

Thursday Oct. 20, 1858. Special Town meeting called to order by the Town Clerk. Motion by Henry Eschle that Ezekiel Ellsworth be chosen Moderator, Appointed. Warrant need by Clerk, Voted the the votes be taken by Yeas and Nays. Voted to raise by taxation the sum of Five-hundred (500) Dollars to defray the Town expence for the current year of 1858 according to the Warrent. Motion by T.D. Smith that hogs be not allowed to run at large on the Town Plat of Chaska, motion passed. Motion by John W. Greggs to raise Fifteen Hundered (1500) Dollars to be appropriated to making and repairing Roads and Bridges, motion passed. Motion by C.S. Wright that hogs under the age of five months shall not be allowed to run at large in the Town of Chaska, motion passed. Motion by C.A. Warner that the meeting be adjourned, sine die

Oct. 30, 1858. Board of Town Supervisors met at my office at 10 o'clock in the forenoon agreeable to adjournment. Notified John Schafer and Jacob Slischer to remove all fences etc. within the limits of the road commencing in Section 1, Town 115, Range 24, and passing by their claim termainting near Mr. Beck's in the Chaska and Glencoe Road belonging to them written Sixty days from this date. Notified Peter Hesse to distontinue the opening and making of the above mamed road until after the expiration of Sixty days from this date; and to rebuild all fences thrown down by said Hesse belonging to John Schafer. Instructed the Clerk to make out and assess the road tax and make a copy of same for each Road Overseer, Also to make the assessment of the \$500. Voted to be raised for Town purposes at last meeting.

No other business comming before this Honorable Board, they adjourned.

Mar. 2, 1859. Board of Supervisors met at my office according to notice posted at 10 o'clock in the forencen. A Petition being on file for a road running through Land owned by John G. Loy - T. D. Smith and others, the location having been examined by the Supervisors on the 16 day of February. The Petition was rejected and a remonstrance against such road being on file accepted, and the Supervisors consider it unnecessary to have a road located there. Notified the Clerk to record the following decision of the County Board, they adjourned until the 7th day of April A.D. 1859 at 10 o'clock A.M.

Feb. 1, 1859. Four committee appointed to examine the Road petitions for and remonistrated against passing through the lands of Mr. Jacob Slicker and others would respectfully report that we have examined the present and proposed rout@and find that as regards the proposed alteration if accepted, the road would have to pass through swamps, that would require a great deal of labor and cost to the Town and in fact a continued outlay to R oad in possible condition. Four committee would therefore report in favor of the Road as at present surveyed.

Mar. 31, 1859. The Board of Supervisors met at my office at 10 o'clock A.M. Instructed the clerk to issue orders to all indivd-duels having claims against this Town accepted by the Board of Auditors (which called for and instructed the clerk to make statement) saying that this Board would advise and recommend that \$500 be raised to defray expenses at the Town next year and same be read at Town meeting Apr. 5, 1859. Board adjourned sine die.

Agreeable to this notice posted by the clerk on the 23rd day of March A.D. #859. The citizens legal voters of the Town of Chaska, County of Carver, State of Minnesota met at the School House in the City of Chaskarafore said on the 5th day of April A.D. 1859 for the purpose of holding their annual Town meeting. Meeting called to order by the clerk at five minutes before 10 o'clock A.M. Ezikial Ellsworth was chosen Moderator by acclamination. Frederick Greiner chairman of the Board of Supervisors being absent, and Henry Eschle one of the Supervisors being chosen excused from serving, and one of the Judges of the Election Chas Ratz and Jacob Beihoffer serving, and one of the Judges of the Election. Ches Ratz and Jacob Beihoffer were chosen to act as Judges in their places, Oath administrated to the Moderator and Judges by T.D. Smith Justice of the Peace. Polls opened for balloting. A motion made by Jacob Biahoffer to let hogs of all ages run at largethe whole year, seconed amended by T.D. Smith to exclude the Town Plat of Chaska Another motion amended seconed and voted down, amended seconed by J.M. Troll by adding thereto animals of all kinds, secoffed and passed. The origional motion with the seconed amended passed. Motion by J.M. Troll that all fences in the Town of Chasks be made of good substential stuff, 42 feet high, seconeded, amended by Jacob Biahoffer that the rails or boards shall not be more than six inches apart, accepted. Amended seconeded by J.G. Loy that from 22 feet from the bottom of the fence, that the space between the rails or boards shall not exceed 4 inches, accepted. The motion with its amendment passed the house.

Motion by John Koch that no Pound Master be elected at this meeting, passed. Motion by John Koch that \$400 be raised to defray the expences of the Town the comming year, amended by C.S. Wright that \$500 instead of \$400 be raised did not pass the House. Amended, seconded by John W. Gregg that \$300 instead of \$400 be raised did not pass the House. Original motion passed. Motion by T.D. Smith that the meeting be adjourned for dinner from 12 o'clock noon until 1 o'clock P.M. passed.

Proceeded to ballot for the following officers to wit; 3 Supervisors with one of them designated as Chairman. 1 Town Clerk. 1 Assessor. 1 Collector. 4 Road Overseers. 1 Overseer of the Poor.

Polls closed at 4 o'clock P.M. The notice having been given thirty minutes before said hour. The Moderator, Clerks and Judges then proceeded to Canvass the votes publicly and continued without intermission until done, and the results read by the Clerk as follows; to wit;

Previous to closing the Polls, motion by T.D. Smith that the report of the Town meeting be read, passed, Clerk read the same, motion by A.C. Fisher that the Supervisor be instructed to purchasa a road scraper for each Road District in this Town, passed. Motion by C.S. Wright that the clerk be instructed to procure a new Ballot Box at the expence of the Town, passed. Motion by A.C. Warner that Town orders drawn Ten per cent interest per annum, did not pass. Motion made to adjourned.

Apr. 23, 1859. Board of Supervisors met at the office of Register of Deeds at 10 o'clock A.M. Apr. 23, A.D. 1859 according to the notice posted. It was agreed that the current year the Poll Tax 'took on the Road Mills be only three (3) days for each person taxable, it was further agreed that the Road Tax be for the current year 30% on \$100. The clerk be instructed to give every overseer of highways the list of last year Tax read with all the names of the men taxed for work on the Road and they have (the overseers) to count them and make return to the next meeting of the Board of Supervisors. It was decided to purchase two (2) Scrapers for the one of the four districts of the Town at the cost of Eleven (11) Dollars price. The Clerk instructed to deliver the list of the Delinquants for the Road Tax for the year 1858 to the County Tressure for collection. Motion made by Charles Gebhard to ajourn until the thirteenth day of May next 1859. Accepted and adjourned
