Schubert was elected Pound Master, and the following by-laws were passed that Hogs, and Sheep be restricted from running at large, Mules and Horses be also restricted from running at large, Also that Oxen, Mules and Horses be restricted from running at large under the penalty of \$1.00 for each, and the fines to go to the Town funds, and the Supervisors shall furnish a Pound. Clerk, D. Stone. Supervisors, P. Henk chairman, F. Wolff and J. Ehrmantrout. Treasurer, Wm Brinkhaus. Assessor, Mathias Loglin and also as Constable.
